Dear Parishes,

From 2000 to 2015, eight Millenium Development Goals addressed the needs of the poorest on earth with some success. Since 2006, the Episcopal Diocese of Milwaukee supported the achievement of the MDGs by assigning 0.7% of our diocesan budget toward their achievment. The newly formulated Sustainable Millenium Goals (*see below) build on the progress made thus far. The Commission on Global Reconciliation is seeking your input as we prepare to recommend distribution of our diocesan 0.7% SDG funds.

In 2018, our SDG funds were allocated to the diocesan Haiti Project (\$2000) to assist in the construction of a computer laboratory at St. Marc's School in Jeannette and to our Companion Diocese of Newala, Tanzania (\$3334) to assist in the purchase of medical instruments urgently needed at St. Michael's Health Center in Lulindi.

The amount in this year's diocesan budget is \$5481 (plus \$5,000 which pays part of salary of the Coordinator of The Haiti Project.)

We will be meeting in July to consider your ideas, and will send our recommendations for distribution of the funds to the Executive Council for deliberation at their August meeting.

In order to decide between a number of worthy requests, we have established the following guidelines:

- a. That the money will be used to directly meet one or more of the Sustainable Development Goals.
- b. That there be a continuing relationship between the recipient and members of the diocese.
- c. That the funds do not go to a third party funding organization, but directly to a program that is administering/using the funds.
- d. That there be demonstrated accountability in the form of a report, letter, pictures, or the like.

Please take time to talk with parishioners and solicit their ideas.

In your recommendations please include:

- 1. Name of the Agency
- 2. Name and Address of Contact Person (and email if available)
- 3. Amount Requested
- 4. How and to whom funds are transferred for this program
- 5. A description of the program, including specifics about how the money will be used. Feel free to include pictures if you have them
